

Springtide Research Institute® BIPOC Research Fellowship Program

Timeframe: June 1, 2023, to May 30th, 2024

Organization: Springtide Research Institute® is a nonprofit and nonsectarian organization that conducts applied research in the social scientific tradition. Compelled by the urgent desire to listen and attend to the lives of young people, ages 13 to 25, Springtide is home to the single largest dataset on young people, religion, and spirituality in the United States. Amplifying young people's lived experiences through rigorous mixed-method applied research and evidence-based actionable insights, Springtide generates multiple research reports annually to help those who care about young people build better models of care and support. Description: This year, Springtide seeks a BIPOC research fellow with deep substantive knowledge of the religious and spiritual lives of Latinos in the U.S. The 2023–2024 BIPOC Fellow will join an ongoing project to better understand and support the flourishing of Latinos young adults. In addition, the BIPOC Fellow's work may include analysis of existing data, or the development and conduction of new projects for Springtide. The goal is to provide the BIPOC Fellow with experience in applied research using Springtide's nationally representative data sets on the faith lives of young people and communicating findings to stakeholders and practitioners in accessible ways.

Support: Fellows are supported with a \$15,000 annual stipend and \$1,000 for professional development. Approximately 90% of work is focused on Springtide research needs and 10% is reserved for professional development and networking in conjunction with each Fellow's individual professional goals. All Springtide data is available for Fellows as well as access to copyeditors, designers and other production supports. Fellows will work directly under the supervision of Springtide's Senior Research Associate.

Expectations: The Fellowship program is remotely based with an expectation of 10 hours/week of work. There may be opportunities to travel for in-person staff meetings. Attendance at weekly team meetings is expected.

Eligibility: The Springtide Research Institute BIPOC Fellowship Program is open to ABD graduate students in the social sciences including, but not limited to sociology, anthropology, religious studies, history and psychology. BIPOC Fellows are selected on the basis of their commitment to the faith lives of young people both within and outside of traditional, institutional spaces. Additionally, Fellows are chosen based on their academic achievement, applied research ability, professional potential and must self-identify as Black, Indigenous, and/or a Person of Color including Latino, Asian, or mixed race. Fellows must be citizens or non-citizen nationals of the U.S., have been lawfully admitted to the U.S. for permanent residence, or be eligible under DACA.
